We are a multidisciplinary team that combines wet-lab experimentation with bioinformatics. In particular, we perform computational analyses of large data sets generated to next-generation sequencing instruments.

The successful candidate will set up and maintain a high performance computing (HPC) infrastructure of Linux cluster nodes and will take care of data storage/backup for a group of 10-15 bioinformaticians. Aside from on-site computing, the group uses the Vienna Scientific Cluster (VSC) to meet its computational needs. Further duties will involve installing and updating locally used scientific software.
