As part of the FWF basic research project "Towards a New Radical Approach to Planning: "Taking Arendt's Theory of Action Seriously", we are recruiting for a post-DOC position for the duration of the project. The advertised position is embedded in an interdisciplinary research team, based at the University of Natural Resources and Applied Life Sciences Vienna (Institute of Landscape Planning). Throughout the project, there will be close cooperation within the team and with different actors in planning and policy.

The project is located in the field of high-risk research and offers the possibility to break new ground in planning theory. The project team is addressing the question of how the currently seemingly irreconcilable gap between agonistic and communicative approaches to planning theory can be overcome in order to generate adequate responses to the crises of our time. To this end, the non-hierarchical concept of political action of the theorist Hanna Arendt will be transferred to spatial planning in order to rethink participatory planning from this perspective and to formulate a new radical approach to spatial planning offering both democratic, inclusive decision-making and starting points for profound structural changes. In a co-creative process with different actors in spatial planning, a new radical approach to planning will be designed and tested through case study analysis, workshops, performances and simulation games.

Responsibilities

- Participation in the research team of a third-party funded project
- Collection of project-relevant data using methods of empirical social research via case studies, literature study and processing of secondary data
- Qualitative and quantitative data analysis using spatial science methods (content analysis of documents, interpretation of primary data, mapping)
- Collaboration in the planning and implementation of workshops with a variety of actors
- Writing and publishing scientific articles in English for scientific journals
- Collaboration in project management, dissemination and outreach activities

Required skills and qualifications

- Doctoral degree/PhD in a relevant subject area or a thematically appropriate degree programme with a social science, political science or engineering orientation
- Language skills: German C2 and English C1
- Work experience in academia or at relevant research institutions
- Publication experience in the field of science
- Expertise in the field of planning theory
- Experience with social science methods
- Interest in planning theory and political science
