### Which financial support do you have in Austria?

#### Remission of tuition fees

You have the right to an exemption of the tuition fee if the degree of your disability has been assessed with at least 50 per cent (according to federal regulations). You find further information at the <u>study</u> services at BOKU.

There is no remission of the **student** union fee!

### Opportunities for incoming or outgoing students

For students and staff with physical, mental- or health-related conditions the Erasmus+ program offers the opportunity for specials grants during your stay. Further information you will find at the website of the Erasmus+ program.

#### Increased study aid

If the degree of your disability has been assessed with at least 50 per cent (according to federal regulations), you might have the right for increased the federal student aid. The duration of claim is expanded. You need the general requirements for the federal student aid to be entitled for this increase. For more information contact the study grant department.

#### Grant für barrier- free education

A grant for barrier-free training can be granted to cover the additional effort required for school or vocational training due to a disability. You can find information about requirements, among and duration of a possible funding at the Service centre of the ministry of social affairs.

## Personal assistance at work or university

The regional assistance service centre is responsible, which is in Vienna e. g. WAG (Wiener Assistenzgenossenschaft).

# Social funds of the student union (ÖH BOKU)

It's a financial support for students with disabilities that should compensate additional costs.

### Which rights do students with disabilities have in Austria?

As it is written in the Universities Act 2002 § 2, Abs. 11, is the "special attention to the needs of the handicapped" a guiding principle at Austrian universities. Besides the area of teaching and learning this also includes other services as for instance barrier- free buildings, barrier- free workspaces etc.

According to § 59, Abs. 12 students with disabilities have the right "to be examined according to an alternative method if they suffer from a disability which makes it impossible for them to take an examination in the prescribed manner and the other method does not limit the content and standards of the examination."
