

## **Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)**

### **Do I have to submit every project application to the Ethics Committee?**

- **No.** There is no obligation on the part of the BOKU to submit research projects for a statement by the Ethics Committee. Submissions to the Ethics Committee are always voluntary.
- Usually, applications are submitted for research projects (1) for which the funding agency requests a statement from the Ethics Committee, or (2) the results of which are intended to be published in a scientific journal that requires an ethics statement.
- The Ethics Committee is not in charge of animal experiments (see [information sheet](#) about the difference animal experiments and research on and with animals).

### **The data has already been collected and analysed. The journal to which I want to submit the manuscript requests a statement from the Ethics Committee. Is that still possible?**

- **Yes.** The Ethics Committee at BOKU been installed in October 2020. An application can be submitted 'in retrospect' for all data collected up to December 2022.
- **No.** For all data that will be collected from January 2023, the application must be submitted before the start of data collection.

### **I will submit a project proposal for funding, do I have to submit the final version of the research proposal?**

- **No.** The research proposal submitted to the funding agency does not have to be submitted. It contains a lot of information that is not relevant to the Ethics Committee.
- The application to the Ethics Committee can be submitted independently of the research proposal, which is often still being finalized. The application to the Ethics Committee should briefly describe the overall project and address the ethical aspects in more detail.

### **For a project proposal that will be submitted to a funding agency, not all details (e.g. test design, questionnaire) are known. Is this a problem?**

- **No.** If the details of the research design have not yet been determined or documents such as questionnaires, form for informed consent, etc. are not yet available, they do not have to be submitted. However, the research project and in particular the planned data collection must be described in sufficient details. In addition, the ethically sensitive aspects must be clearly identified (see [checklists](#)) and the application must include a detailed description of how they will be taken into account.
- From the researchers' point of view, it is advisable to submit a new application to the Ethics Committee after the project has been approved, but before the start of data collection. This is particularly relevant if the results are intended to be published in a journal that requests a statement from the Ethics Committee.

### **Are there standard texts to cover the ethical aspects or good practice recommendations?**

- **No.** Each research proposal must be assessed on individually. Different ethical questions arise, and each ethically relevant issue can be addressed in different ways. An awareness of ethical aspects and an ethically sensitive approach that is adapted to the respective project is essential.
- To support the applicant, checklists help to identify the ethically sensitive aspects of a research project. The collection of links refers to further literature that shows ways of taking these ethical aspects into account.

### **Does the ethics committee advise on ethical aspects?**

- **No.** The members of the Ethics Committee only get involved after an application has been formally submitted.
- To support the applicants, there are checklists that help to identify the ethically sensitive aspects of the project. The collection of links refers to further literature that shows ways of taking these ethical aspects into account.
- Note that project managers and supervisors of master theses and dissertations are familiar with ethical questions in research and can provide support when writing the application to the Ethics Committee.
- The office of the Ethics Committee is happy to provide information regarding formal questions or questions about the application process.

### **Is there a submission form?**

- **No.** You are free to format the application as you see fit.
- However, it is recommended to structure the information in your application, in the order of the questions in the checklists.
- Submit your application on-line at following website.

### **How long does it take from submission to receiving the statement?**

- **If the application is complete:** a minimum of 3 weeks, a maximum of 4 weeks.
- An application must be submitted at least 2 weeks before a meeting of the Ethics Committee. The dates of the monthly meetings can be found on the website. After a meeting, the Ethics Committee has a maximum of two weeks to send the statement to the applicant by email (see process description). However, this is usually done within a week.
- Take into account that a final statement is only possible if the application contains all the necessary information (see checklists). If this is not the case, the Ethics Committee may request additional information to be provided. This will delay the final statement.
