### “Transition to a Low Carbon Economy”

Transitioning to a low carbon economy, which is required to halt global warming, will entail significant changes to all economic sectors and individual behaviour. The annual conference of the Austrian Economic Association (NOeG) aims to discuss all aspects of this transition including economic impacts and challenges, regulatory instruments and market designs, potential pathways, and expected changes to all sectors of the economy. The organizers invite submissions on this topic, as well as from all areas of economics including macroeconomics, economic development and growth, environmental and ecological economics, resource and agriculture economics, labour and demographic economics, microeconomics and industrial organization, urban and regional economics, etc.
