

1. The world is flat? Not anymore!


- Looking back on years of globalisation
 - "The World is Flat": "...remain competitive in a global market in which historical and geographic divisions are, according to the author, becoming increasingly irrelevant"
- Strong internationalisation of the A&F sectors
 - Strong international linkages: Inputs, ingredients, in- and export of products, global value chains
 - Capital (technologies, innovations) and labor migration
 - Globalised consumer preferences



2. Due diligence obligations (as defined in the LkSG)





Definition of risk in accordance with international labor and human rights and environmental law

ILO fundamental labor rights:

- Flimination of forced labor
- Freedom of association and the right to collective bargaining
- Elimination of discrimination in respect of employment and occupation
- Abolition of child labor
- Occupational health and safety

Pollutant related environmental conventions:

- Minamata-Convention (handling of mercury)
- Stockholm Convention (handling of persistent organic pollutants)
- Baseler Convention (importation and exportation of hazardous waste)

In addtion:

- Illegal evictions or illegal seizure of land, forests etc
- Withholding of decent wage
- Deployment of security forces that use violence
- etc.


2. Due diligence obligations in EUDR



- 1. Collection of information on origin of product (country, compliance with national regulations, ...)
 - Including **geo-referenced data** on information on origin
 - Relevant due date for deforestation: 31.12.2020
- 2. Own risk assessment
- 3. Initiate measures to reduce risk, if necessary









Adjustments of companies based in Germany





Different mechanisms to coordinate the value chain

 High risks of human rights violations and problematic labour conditions in agri-food value chains remain despite voluntary approaches






Child labour ILO and UNICEF 2021

- Deforestation risk strongly related to agricultural commodities







4. Recommendations contributing to a sucessful implementation





- Implement due diligence as a learning system
- Support supplier development
 - Provide support service, e.g. in the form of financial support as part of public programmes
- Integrate certification schemes in the implementation and guarantee their reliability
 - Define minimum requirements for certification schemes and officially monitor certification schemes
- Focus on grievance mechanisms
 - Strengthen civil soceity actors and trade unions on the part of trading partners

4. Recommendations contributing to a successful implementation



... for shaping the policy environment

- On the external dimension: Support scenarios
 "Cooperation and dialogue" and "Stay and behave"
 - Ensure coherence across different policies
 - Advance the dialogue with tradings partners
 - Intensify and enhance development cooperation
- Ensure coherence
 - Better align different approaches
 - Consider the joint "geo-political" effect of the whole package:
 - Due dilligence and FTAs as complements and as tools to relieve and support FTAs (e.g. by taking over enforcement and waive them in FTAs)
- Advance the dialogue with tradings partners
 - Consider incentives instead of sanctions only
 - Recognize local knowledge and approaches
- Intensify and enhance development cooperation

4. Recommendations contributing to a sucessful implementation



... for a systematic continued development

- Schedule impact assessment of regulations from the outset
 - Trading partners need to be involved at all stages
- Consider carefully the challenges before
 extending the scope of due diligence obligations
 (e.g. regarding gender equality, living income
 and living wage, right to food or biodiversity)
 - Consult trading partners prior to any extension of scope
- Cover gender equality along the whole value chain








5. Implementation: one year LkSG in Germany



- 486 controls, of which 78 were event-related
 - Topical focus mostly risk management and grievance mechanism
- 38 complaints
 - Of which 20 had no relation to the due diligence oblitations of the LkSG or were not sufficiently substantiated
 - In six cases, the responsible authority got in touch with the companies; company feedback indicated that they are dealing intensively with these complaints
- No sanctions imposed up to now

5. Final remarks and outlook



- Success of due diligence regulations is achieved, if the situation of human rights and labor standards along global supply chains improve and new deforestation is no longer taking place
 - Support companies to achieve "stay and behave" instead of "cut and run" in order to contribute to positive developments on the ground
- Focus on implementation and impact to achieve success (avoid due diligence regulations turning into bureaucratic nightmares)
- A partnership approach towards third countries must be strengthened, in particular in this changing geopolitical environment
- More research needed!
