## ANOUK VOGEL (\*1977) II

Anouk Vogel (Geneva, CH, 1977) studied landscape architecture at the Manchester Metropolitan University in England. She graduated in 2001 with Honors and Distinction. After her studies she moved to the Netherlands where she worked for West 8, Bureau B+B, and Petra Blaisse. In 2007 she founded her own practice. Two years later she won among other prizes the competition for the new furniture of the Vondelpark, a Dutch national heritage monument. In 2010 she was selected as one of the winners of the Prix de Rome, the prestigious Dutch prize for architects under 35. Keen to let go of conventions, Anouk Vogel is a landscape architect who continuously seeks to push the boundaries of her profession. Her meticulously crafted sculptures, drawings, ephemeral and permanent works form visual thoughts and are invitations to reflect upon our relation to the environment that surrounds us.
