ProstoRož | The group explores degraded urban situations, addresses the problems of public open space and searches for new modes of utilisation. In 2004 the group realised their first project, entitled "ProstoRož", creating temporary installations highlighting the potential of courtyard situations in the centre of the old town. In the following year the group suggested the redefinition of urban green spaces through the installation of innovative park equipment.

Where is the art of gardening? | As city planner (IFU Paris) and landscape architect (ENSP Versailles) by training, we work mainly on redefining and improving public and semi-public spaces in an urban environment.
