<b>Topic</b>	<b>The Relationship of Midwifery and Organics</b>
<b>Goal</b>	To deepen the understanding about nutrition and feeding guidance of midwives toward mothers and their children
<b>Description</b>	Austria is known as being one of Europe's countries most involved in organic from hectares farmed to percentage of products consumed. Additionally, it is known that many 'organic' consumers were introduced into organic when they became parents. Yet, there is little known about the specific relationship of the values of midwifery and their pre and post-birth guidance in connection with organic and nutrition and feeding to new mothers and babies. To explore this topic we wish to conduct qualitative interviews with midwives and mothers of different ages to understand what values of organic may be shared, specifically related to diet and dietary suggestions for pre and post birth nutrition.
