Future Forests

Forest management, use and tenure are critical factors touching many of the Sustainable Development Goals. Forests provide timber, fuel wood, forage for livestock and raw material for paper production. Non-timber forest products contribute to livelihoods and serve as sources of food. Forest tenure determines who can use which resources under which conditions. As in many areas, gender equality is still to be reached.

What can we do to render forest use more sustainable, ecologically sound and fair? Which rules hinder the sustainable use and management of forests? Which tools can we employ to change them? What type of training and higher education supports a transition to more sustainable ways of forest use and management?

This workshop provides a platform for trans-disciplinary exchange and mutual learning.
