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## Visit to the City of Našice on 13 June 2017 – provisional presentation

**Departure from Osijek by bus: 12.30**

**Arrival to Našice: 13.15**

In the Slavonian city of Našice, well known trading center dating back to the Middle Ages, there is a long tradition of nobility, but the castles of Pejačević family, built in the 19th and 20th centuries, are of relatively recent origin. The big Baroque castle was built in 1812, and was completely renovated a half a century later when it actually received its present appearance.



Most of the rooms of the castle are taken up today by the local **Ethnographic and Historical Museum of Našice**, with displays of historic periods from prehistoric up to the Second World War. The life of the nobility is represented by the remaining photos and mementos of the Pejačević family.

A more modest Croatian lifestyle is represented in what is called the "Peasant Room" set up as the interior of a typical three-room rural home. A weaving and spinning exhibit is quite colorful.



The Pejačević family gave some of the most important Croatian political figures, but the person most connected with the house is Croatia's first woman composer, Dora Pejačević.



The castle is surrounded by a park with many native and exotic trees and shrubs. It is protected horticultural monument with an artificial lake.



## Excursion to Baranja on 15 June 2017 – provisional presentation

**Departure from Osijek by bus: 10.00 a.m.**

Short stop in the village of **Bilje**, sightseeing of the castle of Prince Eugene of Savoy.



Visit to the **Nature Park Kopački Rit**.  
Visit to the Tikveš Castle.

Short drive to **Karanac**. Walk along the „Street of Forgotten Time“, visit to the ancient barbershop, the inn "Under the Pear", serving traditional drinks from a bar with sausages and bacons hanging over. There are also pottery, clog, carpenter and barrel workshops, as well as weaving and basket workshops, summer kitchen, clay house and icehouse, all reflecting the spirit of the past times. There are no television or loud music (except for the traditional instrument *tamburica*). Each of around ten houses tells its own story.



Lunch will be offered in the traditional restaurant **Baranjska kuća**. The lunch will include welcome drink and traditional meat/fish dishes.

Drive to **Batina**, sightseeing of the monument "Julka". Visit to the Museum of the Batina Battle, exhibiting arms from the Battle of Batina, as well as pieces of art made by artistic colonies.



Ride through the Baranja Vineyards;  
Visit to the typical **wine cellar**, where the visitors will be introduced to the process of wine making.

**Return to Osijek late in the afternoon (around 20.00 p.m.).**
