7. Gastland

In case this is your first time traveling to the US, it might be a bit of culture shock; the amount of homeless people can be somewhat disturbing, the lack of reliable public transport system, generally the 'American way' can be quite overwhelming. The consumer culture really is on another level, it permeates literally every aspect of their daily family and professional life. People tend to be superficial, but helpful. If you travel around, be cautious and stay in safe areas. Travelling around is expensive, the cheapest airlines are Spirit and Frontier, there are limited bus and train options available, but I highly recommend trying out the Amtrak train, there is even a train going from NY down to the South, but also a connection from Atlanta to New Orleans (https://www.amtrak.com/regions/south.html). The car-sharing options are not really available, so team up with fellow travellers. I recommend a Facebook group called Host a Sister for women who want to meet and stay in safe places with other women. The food is rather low quality everywhere, but I highly recommend trying out their farmers market (there is one in Athens as well http://athensfarmersmarket.net/locations). You can pay everywhere with a credit card, but check your bank fees, it is also possible to open an American bank account, but it is less hassle if you have something like Revolut that offers a fair exchange rate. Some things are ridiculously expensive, like deodorant for example (8 bucks for the same brand that you'd get in Europe).

8. Gastinstitution

UGA is a very well organised University. They really make sure that their students have access to all types of tools and facilities. There are a lot of organisations that are super active on campus, so I highly recommend checking some out. During the orientation week they introduce you to all possible activities and resources, so make sure to take advantage of those. They also offer a lot of support in terms of mental health, financial struggles and so on, they really take excellent care of their students. The campus is enormous and public transport is free, but unreliable. I recommend getting a bike from craigslist or signing up for free on at this link: https://tps.uga.edu/alternative-transportation/bulldog-bike-share/. You basically write them an email and a professor or a mentor writes a reference for you, and you get a bike to use while you are there. The big supermarkets are reachable with a bike or car, there is a smaller Target in the center of town. The dining halls offer a variety of foods, but I opted out of that because it is not particularly healthy, but they offer a good price. I only took phD courses, so this might be the reason for my experience, but the classes are very time consuming; do not underestimate the workload. I signed up for 7 classes and dropped 3 of them. The professors thought I was crazy to even sign up for 7. Do reach out to the professors, they are insanely helpful and kind. Most even write recommendation letters for you just because they want to help. The structure of signing up for classes and the overview is a bit complicated and not that well organised, but your coordinator at UGA will be of huge help there.

The financial support that you get through the scholarship covered my flight ticket and maybe 2-3 months of accommodation. There might be other grants available in Austria, but I could not qualify for them because I am not an Austrian citizen, but you should check out your 'Bundesland's grants aswell. You need to complete a medical checkup to get the visa which costs around 300 eur, depending on which vaccines you need additionally.

You have to pay your student dorm and some other fees (orientation, insurance, etc), directly through their website. I paid 3000 dollars for the semester (insurance is obligatory, dorm, orientation and lodging during orientation).

As mentioned above, people tend to be a bit superficial and some of the prejudices about sororoties in the US and the big social class differences are very true and real, so be prepared for that. Get involved with people who attend International Coffee Hour and find you people through numerous organisations at the campus (they have over 800!). Especially in the south, Church is a huge thing and even if you are not religious, it is an interesting experience; their churches are indeed something else. There you also find a lot of people who will want to engage with you, help you in any way possible, etc. Also the students have their own ministries that organise trips and help for internationals, and they really are a bunch of lovely people, but it might be a bit unfamiliar to Europeans to hear as much 'God talk' as you most probably will.

Athens is a lovely community. There are numerous bars, churches and activities one can do in nature. They are big on football and whenever there is a game, the town is absolutely packed and crazy; bars are full, roads are filled, parking lots are barbecue and music spots (it is called tailgating). You get 3 tickets for home football games and you should definitely go to at least one, just to experience that. Alternatively you can also upsell them, there's a bunch of groups on GroupMe for that. All their groups can be found by QR codes on GroupMe, and you will easily find them on campus and people will share that with you on the daily. There is a farm owned by UGA that can be accessed by public transport and then biking, but be warned: a part of the road is kind of scary, because it looks like a highway (it is not though) and there is no lane for bikes + people are not used to having bikers on the road so be extra careful. If you contact people of that farm, they will give you a tour (https://www.caes.uga.edu/about/personnel/person.html/21952/joeydavid-clark.html). Athens has a few parks and walking paths that are worth checking out. Even if google maps tells you that you can bike somewhere it is not always the case, you have to bike on the main road and that does not feel safe AT ALL but it is doable (I did it multiple times). I recommend using esim card, like the one from mint mobile, pretty affordable. There is also a rescue farm that you can visit with Dogs for the Paws https://www.instagram.com/dogsforthepaws/ or on your own, but they organise visits every Saturday or Sunday.

Uga also has free musical concerts in the UGA Performing Arts Center, so check that out. Many places offer student discount, so always show your UGA card.

People will be surprised if you walk around places because it is generally thought that that is not safe, however I walked to campus from my dorm (1h away by foot), also during the night and you should be cautious due to the drug abusers and homeless people, but it isnt neccesarily dangerous. There is an UGA Safe app as well that helps you contact UGA police quickly if something happens. However, I would say use a bike rather than being on foot, because there are indeed some sketchy places that you do not want to spend too much time dwelling in.
