Information on the processing of personal data

As of 25 May 2018 the Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation, GDPR) is directly applicable in all Member States of the European Union.

The GDPR, inter alia, provides for extended information requirements in regard to the processing of personal data. In fulfilment of those obligations (in particular Art 13 GDPR) we are hereby informing you about the processing of your personal data carried out by us.

1. What type of personal data (hereinafter "Data") will be processed?

Contact details (e.g. name, email address, telephone number).

2. What is the purpose of the data processing?

I. Registration/processing of the event

The data mentioned in point 1 will be processed for the proper registration and handling of the event.

II. contact tracing

Data on infections with the coronavirus and on suspected cases are among the sensitive data for which data protection law provides special protection. However, data protection law also provides that these health data may be used to the extent necessary to contain the spread of the virus and to protect fellow human beings. This includes, in particular, the collection of data from persons who have been diagnosed with an infection or who are suspected of being infected due to contact with an infected person or due to a stay in a risk region.

In the case of the collection of visitor data or data of BOKU members involved, the purpose of processing is to facilitate contact with them and to contain the spread of infection, i.e. for preventive health care and public health purposes.

3. What is the legal basis for the data processing?

Art 6 (1) (b) GDPR - required for the fulfilment of a contract concluded with the data subject

Art 6 (1) (c) GDPR – required for the fulfilment of a legal obligation of the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna

Art 6 (1) (e) GDPR – the processing is in the public interest or is carried out in the exercise of official authority Art 6 (1) (f) GDPR – required to safeguard the following legitimate interests of the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna or a third party (the interests or fundamental rights or freedoms of the data subject do not prevail):

The legitimate interest lies in the containment of the spread of infection (collection of contact data in order to protect fellow human beings and employees and, in the event of an incident, to accelerate the collection of the authority as well as to contribute to the reduction of the risk of spreading).

4. Is there an obligation for you as a data subject to provide your Data to the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna?

Yes, since the provision of the Data is a statutory or contractual requirement.

If the Data is not provided, this will result in the following: you cannot attend the event.

5. Is automated decision-making (including profiling) part of the processing? No

6. Will the Data be transferred to other persons or entities in whole or in part?

The transmission of information on specific cases of infection to the health authorities is based on a legal basis pursuant to Art 9 (2) (i) DSGVO in conjunction with § 10 (2) DSG.

In addition, at the request of the district administrative authorities, BOKU as an employer may be obliged to provide information on suspected cases and infections according to Art 9 (2) (i) DSGVO in conjunction with § 5 (3) Epidemic Act 1950.

7. Are the recipients mentioned under Item 6 located outside the EU/outside the EEA and/or are they an international organisation?

8. How long will the Data be stored and/or what are the criteria for determining the storage period?

For the traceability of contacts, disclosed data will be deleted 28 days after the event, unless there are legal obligations to store the data.

9. What are your rights as a data subject?

Generally, you have a right to request from the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna access to and rectification or erasure of your Data or restriction of processing concerning you or to object to processing as well as the right to data portability.

To exercise these rights please contact our data protection officer (for contact details see Item 10). In addition, you have the right to lodge any appeals you may have with the data protection authority.
