

Declaration of consent under data protection law

The University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna takes the protection of personal data seriously. The protection of individual privacy when processing personal data is an important concern for us, which we take into account with great attention in our business processes.

1. Data processing for the management and support of your employment relationship The University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna processes the personal data (categories of data) provided by you and collected, created and stored in the context of your employment relationship for the proper handling and support of your employment relationship and insofar as this is provided for by law. Any further processing of your personal data (categories of data) in accordance with the enclosed 'Information on the processing of personal data' will only take place with your voluntary consent.

Information on personal data processing

As of 25 May 2018, the Regulation of the European Parliament and Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to processing personal data and the free movement of such data and repealing directive 95/46/EC became applicable in all member states of the European Union (General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)).

One aspect of the GDPR is its increased obligations to provide information with regard to processing personal data. In compliance with these obligations (in particular with article 13 of the GDPR), we are hereby informing you of how we process your personal data.

1. Which personal data (shortened to "data") are processed?

Place of residence, name, medical record (particularly diagnosis/diagnoses, treatment plan), accident details (What? Where? How? When?).

2. What is the purpose of this data processing?

This data shall be processed

1) for the purposes of implementing the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna's (BOKU's) emergency plan (particularly the rescue chain and informing relatives), and

2) for the purposes of handling your insurance claim within the scope of the travel insurance offered by BOKU.

3. What is the legal basis of this data processing?

Article 6 (1) (a) of the GDPR - consent (in the context of the application)

We draw your attention to the fact that this consent can be withdrawn at any time with future effect. This will cause no detrimental consequences for you.

X the following detrimental consequences for you: The implementation of BOKU's emergency plan and/or handling of your insurance claim within the scope of travel insurance offered by BOKU cannot be guaranteed.

Such a withdrawal of consent will certainly result in us no longer processing your data for the aforementioned purposes from the time of withdrawal and in particular in us deleting any (remaining) stored data of yours, insofar as these data are not being processed on one of the following legal bases.

- Article 6 (1) (b) of the GDPR processing is necessary for performing a contract concluded with the data subject Article 6 (1) (c) of the GDPR processing is necessary for complying with a legal obligation to which the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna, is subject
- oxtimes Article 6 (1) (d) of the GDPR processing is necessary for protecting the vital interests of the data subject or another natural person
- Article 6 (1) (e) of the GDPR processing occurs in the public interest or in the course of exercising official authority

Article 6 (1) (f) of the GDPR – processing is necessary for preserving the following legitimate interests of the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna, or a third party (the interests or basic rights and freedoms of the data subject shall not take precedence over these interests): Legitimate interests shall be detailed here.

4. As a data subject, do you have a duty to provide your data to the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna?
