- 1. City, country and people + social integration Lyon is a very beautiful French city with moderate climate in Summer and Winter. Whole Lyon has a stunning architecture, especially inside the old city where roads are getting narrow, and no cars are allowed. Lyon is great for cycling, so bring a cycle or rent one. Lyon is not far from the French alps within 1 hour you can go hiking, skiing and whatever mountains can provide. Since I already knew people living in Lyon, I got good socially integrated.
- 2. Accommodation

 I found a nice studio apartment not far from the campus and in a good area for an affordable price, but I started to look for it in the end of the previous semester.
- 3. Costs and expenses

 The living cost in France are higher. I spend around 1.5 times on food what I spend in Vienna. Public transportation is very affordable, and for 16 €/a you can get public bicycles everywhere in the city.

 Lyon metropolitan area is the 2nd populates area in France. Trains are running to all of France, Germany, Switzerland. Bus connections are also available to Italy.
