Research Report

(Brief report of stay abroad from scientific point of view, ca. 1 page)

During my Master thesis I explored the venom of an Australian spider, to understand how its venom works, what molecules it contains with the idea of discovering interesting molecules that can be turned into bioinsecticides or therapeutics. I got to work in the interface of venomics and pharmacology and got to see, how venoms are studied and turned into medicines potentially curing diseases like ALS or epilepsy. My project was a good mix of Mass-spectrometry, transcriptomics and bioinformatics as part of venomics and high throughput bioassays using human neuroblastoma cells to understand the mechanism of how the venom works. We also used chemical synthesis to synthesise toxins and further characterise their activity in humans and later on also in insects in insecticidal assays using drosophila melanogaster as model organism and American cockroaches as a second reference organism.

I got to participate in Journal clubs, present my work (progress) in lab meetings which helped improve my presentation skills in English a lot. During my stay, I got the opportunity to participate in 3 conferences, where I was offered to present my work as a poster. This not only provided insight into the academic world, but also helped a lot in networking with other scientists within Australia. It obviously also helps a lot to get in contact with well established scientists, as they have collaborators all over the world and can assist with advice for either a PhD or in general career possibilities. Collaboration here is very important so there are many opportunities to work in a interdisciplinary project and learn different perspectives one can have on a research project.
