General Report

I attended three lectures that were all incredibly interesting. The workload should not be underestimated as there are a lot of papers to write, instead of exams to take. The lectures I visited were MGMT615, ERST620 and ERST 630. ERST630 being the mandatory one. All of them are taught by teachers who take great effort in helping any student and creating a warm study environment.

I recommend staying on or near campus as it is convenient for meeting new people and being involved in the clubs and events happening on campus. For staying on campus Farm Road is the best if you enjoy meeting new people and being more in the centre. The Farmroad Flats are also newer than the ones at Crescent. Crescent is quieter (but closer to the supermarket) and the flats are rather old. A supermarket is close by and some restaurants as well. As mentioned above public transport in New Zealand is not the best so renting or buying a car is adviced. I recommend doing the course work during the week to keep weekends free for traveling as the surrounding area and the Canterbury region has a lot to offer. Christchurch is a beautiful city and the view from the Christchurch Gondola is amazing. Sumner Beach is another nice place close-by as well as Akaroa. While New Zealand is not as cold as Austria during the winter months the cold I still recommend bringing sufficiently warm clothes as the proximity of a lot of towns to the ocean makes the chill pretty intense. Also New Zealand is a paradise for hikers, so bringing enough good hiking equipment is a must to really experience the country.

What did you gain the most out of your stay abroad?

New friends in various countries, improved intercultural communication skills. an improved understanding of different education systems. And more in-depth knowledge as well as new skills & knowledge in my area of study.

Which particular piece of advice would you give interested students?

The workload should not be underestimated. Renting a car is advised. To truly experience the country one should go hiking.
