Also I recommend you to get a decent car (or campervan) or otherwise you will be stuck in Lincoln (there is not much to do around there) and you have to drive out of the Canterbury plains for the great NZ scenery.

If you are unsatisfied with your accomodation don't hesitate to talk to the accomodation office ladies, they are very kind and will surely find a solution that works for you.

Try to get get out of the "BOKU bubble" as much as possible. My greatest experience was to make a lot of new friends from all over the world and especially in NZ. Also great if you plan to work abroad as you get lots of connections to people from your field.

I would also recommend organizing your stay so that you have some time to travel after the semester is done. If possible, save up some money, the travelling here gets quite expensive when you have to pay for gas, food, accomodation etc.. There are many great things to do like sky diving (highly recommend), hobbington movieset, helicopter flights that are not cheap but definetly worth the money.
