Dissection of membrane transporter structure and function – lessons from a fungal paradigm

In his talk he will present highlights concerning how fungal genetics, combined with new methodologies for assaying their cellular expression and function, as well as, recent structural approaches, have led to the functional dissection of a prototypical purine transporter from the filamentous fungus *Aspergillus nidulans*.

Transporters are transmembrane proteins mediating the selective uptake or efflux of solutes, metabolites, drugs or ions across cellular membranes. Despite their immense biological importance in cell nutrition, communication, signaling and homeostasis, their study remains technically difficult mostly due to their lipid-embedded nature. In addition, the study of eukaryotic transporters presents an additional complexity due to multiple subcellular control mechanisms, which operate to ensure their proper membrane traffic, membrane localization and turnover. Model fungi present unique genetic tools to study eukaryotic transporter function.
