



2021 Call for the

City of Vienna Jubilee Funds for the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna

By establishing the "City of Vienna Jubilee Funds for the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna", the City of Vienna honours the cooperation with one of Vienna's most important universities on the occasion of BOKU's 150th anniversary in the year 2022.

The joint and coordinated work on questions by BOKU and the City of Vienna is to promote the potential for synergies between science and economy.

The objectives of the funds are to:

- strengthen scientific cooperation in key issues for the City of Vienna and the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna,
- intensify collaboration between science and economy in BOKU's fields of competence and entwined with the City of Vienna's business areas,
- promote the economic connections with sustainable developments and at the same time strengthen economy and quality of life in Vienna,
- strengthen Vienna as a university and research location by interlinking activities of the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna and the City of Vienna,
- promote young academics at the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna.

The following funding instruments are announced:

- I. Stadt Wien-BOKU Research Funding
- II. BOKU Best Paper Awards
- **III. BOKU Talent Awards** (for excellent Master's theses and dissertations)

In 2021, "Stadt Wien-BOKU Research Funding" funds research projects from all BOKU-related fields in connection with the topic "(Viennese) Ways into the Future /

Crises.Transformation.Sustainability".

For the "BOKU Best Paper Awards" and the "BOKU Talent Awards" submissions from all BOKU-related topics are awarded prizes.

<u>I. Stadt Wien-BOKU Research Funding</u> (Viennese) Ways into the Future / Crises.Transformation.Sustainability

Research projects from all BOKU-related fields with a project sum of 35,000 to 90,000 Euro and a project duration of a maximum of 2 years can be funded. In total the funding budget is up to 175,000 Euro.

This thematic focus will also apply in the calls of 2022-2024, but calls on more specific sub-topics are planned. Submitted projects should present ways of crisis management that contribute or can contribute to a sustainability transformation and to achieving the <u>Sustainable Development Goals</u> (SDGs), referencing the current Corona crisis. Vienna-related projects are particularly encouraged in the context of the recently presented strategy "VIENNA 2030 - Economy & Innovation".

Research projects from all thematic fields of BOKU can be submitted, which contextualise their content contributions to one or several SDGs. Interdisciplinarity is requested.

Stakeholder involvement within an appropriate framework is considered positive and can take place in different forms. The relevance of the involvement must be briefly explained in the proposal.

According to the strategic objectives in BOKU's developmental plan, the research project should be planned and realized considering sustainability and scientific excellence.

As the fund aims to support young researchers, all BOKU researchers with a doctoral degree up to a maximum of seven postdoctoral years and documented previous scientific experience are eligible to apply. University professors are excluded. The project must be carried out mainly at BOKU.

Proposals should be sent in digital form as a single PDF document (max. 5MB) to researchfunds@boku.ac.at using the application form.

- 1) Project description in English or (depending on the topic selection and subject area) German, consisting of:
 - Popular scientific abstract for public relations in German (max. one A4 page)
 - Scientific abstract (in German and English, max. half a page each)
 - Detailed description of the planned research project (five to max. eight pages excl. literature): scientific research question, review of current research and individual preliminary work, project objectives and innovation, detailed working plan incl. methodology, contribution of the research project to the SDGs
 - If applicable, relation of the research question to the corresponding business areas of the city
 of Vienna (about 1 page); an expression of interest by the concerned business area is
 welcome
 - Time and cost schedule: The funding can be used to cover personnel, material and travel expenses related to the project. Project-specific costs of research partners from the Danube region are eligible for funding.
- 2) calculation of costs, see https://short.boku.ac.at/9e6v4r
- 3) detailed résumé including a list of publications and presentation of scientific competence of the applicant and the previous societal impact of the applicant's scientific work in particular in the field of application.
- 4) Suggestion of at least ten potential, exclusively international reviewers (details see application form)

Please complete the internal pre-submission clearance (via ePM) two weeks before the submission deadline.

II. BOKU Best Paper Awards

Every year a maximum of **five outstanding BOKU publications** can be awarded a prize of 1,500 Euro. Publications from all BOKU-related fields can be submitted.

All BOKU graduates and young researchers (max. ten years after successful completion of the doctorate) may apply. The author who has predominantly contributed to the publication is eligible for submission. The publication must have mainly been compiled at BOKU. It must also have been published or accepted for publication since 2019.

- 2) An original scientific paper which was published or has been accepted for publication in a professional peer reviewed journal
- 3) Statement on the publication's prize-worthiness (max. one page)
- 4) Detailed résumé including a list of publications
- 5) In the case of a multi-author publication, a clear description of the nature and scope of the submitter's own share of the work must also be submitted, as well as a signed confirmation that all co-authors have agreed to an application on the basis of this publication.

III. BOKU Talent Awards (for excellent Master's theses and Dissertations)

Every year prizes for outstanding scientific theses from all BOKU-related fields are awarded.

A maximum of **five Master's theses** are awarded with 1,500 Euro each. In addition, a maximum of **three dissertations** are awarded with 3,000 Euro each. The theses must have been approved at BOKU since 2019.

Information on the processing of personal data

The data will be deleted after the call is completed, 6 months after the academic ceremony.

9. What are your rights as a data subject?

Generally, you have a right to request from the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna access to and rectification or erasure of your Data or restriction of processing concerning you or to object to processing as well as the right to data portability.
