
Research Award of the Austrian Hail Insurance

The Austrian Hail Insurance VVaG will award one or more research prizes in 2025 totaling up to EUR 4,000 for outstanding scientific work such as dissertations or master's theses. The target group for the award is students at the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna (BOKU). The prize will be awarded to one or more works from the following subject areas:

In the selection process, special attention will be paid to contributions that improve income or income security in agriculture, as well as to measures for the preservation of agricultural land.

Subject areas:

Crop Production: Impact of weather-related stress situations (hail, frost, drought, etc.) on crops and possible solutions

Risk Management Measures: Risk protection, risk balancing, measures for income stabilization, income security, etc.

Animal Husbandry: Measures to promote animal health

Finance and Management: Business planning, pricing and marketing systems, etc.

Spatial Planning and Soil Protection: Measures against land consumption, sustainable soil cultivation and management practices, promotion and preservation of biodiversity, avoidance of land waste (revitalization of town centers, reuse concepts, etc.)

Application documents:

- Original scientific work
- Abstract
- Evaluation of the work (assessment form)
- Description of the merits of the work
- Detailed CV

The decision on the award will be made by a jury composed of members of the Austrian Hail Insurance and the rectorate of BOKU University, Vienna.

Information on the processing of personal data
