Call for abstracts

This year's theme reflects the fact that rivers and their associated floodplains are closely connected with humanity in manifold ways. Bridging the fields of hydrology, limnology and floodplain ecology, topics cover e.g. water quality and management, invasive species, floods and droughts, multifunctional use and planning, ecosystem services, restoration and conservation and the influence of climate change on the entire hydrologic circle. The conference offers a platform for the exchange of ideas and experiences especially between research and practice from the whole Danube River Basin.

Two keynotes given by Dr. Gregory Egger (Karlsruhe Institute of Technology) and Dr. Rebecca Tharme (The Nature Conservancy) as well as the scientific contributions of the participants will stimulate interesting discussions. Two excursions will give the participants an impression of the German Danube, its beauty, the pressures on the ecosystem and the complexity of floodplain restoration.

Posters and oral presentations are welcome. Submission of abstracts and registration is now open. Deadline for the submission of abstracts is February 29.
